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# AHF Pledges \$10M to the Global Fund

Ahead of the Seventh Replenishment of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria, AHF announced a \$10 million pledge.

# About the Global Fund

In 2002, the world came together to create the Global Fund to fight what were then the deadliest pandemics confronting humanity-AIDS, tuberculosis (TB), and malaria.

Over the 20 years that followed, the Global Fund partnership has invested more than US\$55.4 billion, saving 50 million lives and reducing the combined death rate from the three diseases by more than half in the countries where they invest.

fighting infectious diseases. The conference brings together more than 45 countries, partners. private companies, and community organizations. This support works to save 20 million lives, avert 450 million new infections, and bring new hope for ending AIDS, TB and malaria. AHF's \$10 million investment also strengthens health and community systems leaving no person behind and being resilient to future infectious disease outbreaks. "The Global Fund has demonstrated

sustainable public health system. We hope this pledge encourages

wealthy donor countries, NGOs, and the private sector to contribute their fair share to the Fund so that it can meet or exceed the fundraising goal of \$18 billion."

Donors gathered in New York on Sept. 21 to announce their commitments, which totaled \$14.25 billion. While the UK and Italy are

expected to make their pledge in the coming weeks, AHF is calling China out for its lack of Global Fund support and urging all donors to increase their commitments by 30%.

AHF works with 31 Global Fundsupported countries across Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Caribbean, and Europe to implement HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, and advocacy programs.

AHF's long-running, *Fund the Fund* advocacy campaign, has been a strong proponent of funding the Global Fund via government relations and advocacy in Washington D.C.

# On Call: Choosing Our Providers

AHF Healthcare Centers have provided quality primary care for over thirty years. Our providers are specifically chosen to care for HIV-positive clients, and they are knowledgeable of the most up-todate developments in HIV medical care. That makes hiring the right medical staff one of AHF's most important jobs. In an interview with Brittney Swan, a Talent Acquisition Manager for the Department of Medicine at AHF, Swan discusses the process of finding the right providers to care for HIV patients and the qualities AHF looks for in our doctors.

**Inside Scoop:** Start from the beginning. What's the first step in deciding to bring a new provider to AHF?

**Brittney:** If there is a growing consensus within the clinic that additional staffing is needed, the Regional Medical Director of that bureau, (Carl Millner - western bureau/Bryan Gaudio-southern bureau/Marcelo Venegas-northern bureau) in collaboration with both Dr. Wolfy and Dr. Heglar, will create either a non-budgeted or budgeted position. In our larger markets, like Florida and Texas, there's always a slight chance that an additional provider is needed. Atlanta is another growing area where we have had to make adjustments and recruit additional providers. The goal is to not burn out our staff and to make sure there is adequate coverage from all areas. To push this along, a justification is created. This justification is a thorough outline of what the need is and why it is needed. Once I receive this, I submit it through our applicant tracking system and initiate what we call the approval process.

Once approved, I initiate the recruitment process.

**Inside Scoop:** Once you know a need exists, what do you look for in providers? Brittney: Longevity. Job hopping can be a red flag for a provider. We want our doctors and nurses to be with us long-term to help grow each respective site. We make sure they have the credentials needed like board certification, an unrestricted active license, and HIV management experience. The most important factor is their passion to serve our client base, and their dedication to our mission of providing dignified care to people living with HIV.

Brittney: Yes, when we find a provider that has the credentials needed on paper, there are multiple stages they must go through. First, they speak with the regional medical director, then a site visit to meet with staff, a brief introductory call with the bureau chief, and then a final call with Dr. Wolfy or Dr. Heglar. It is slightly different when hiring a nurse practitioner or physician assistant.

completed, an AHF employee agreement is drafted. Once an offer is accepted, there is a credentialing and background process that they must be submitted. These steps have to be completed before they start and can take anywhere from 1 to 3 months. Once they start, there is an in-depth orientation process to make sure they are exposed to proper training and receive the materials that are needed in order to be successful in their role.

**Inside Scoop:** In your own words, what role do AHF providers play in AHF's mission?

# **Brittney:**

They are the foundation. AHF would not be able to provide the care that our patients need without our providers. They are extremely valuable to this organization. Their passion and the amount of work that they do is impeccable. I hope they know that their work does not ever go unnoticed. They are so respected and I truly enjoy being a part of their journey with AHF.

# **AHF** Launches Opioid Overdose **Prevention Program**

# "And it wouldn't have been the disease that killed me. it would've been my medication."

Dopesick is more than crically acclaimed streaming mini-series. It is real. It is ugly. And it is spreading like an STD.

"Dopesick" is a phrase used by addicts to illustrate a darkness they have become too familiar with-the terrifying physical and mental barriers to guitting a drug that has a deadly grip. Dopesick is when users take opiates to avoid the agony of withdrawal, more so than to get high.

America is struggling with an opioid addiction and AIDS Healthcare Foundation has responded with the launch of its Opioid Overdose Prevention Program. The program offers support and strategies focused on prevention and increased access to effective treatment.

The cruel reality is that opioid overdose has killed nearly 69,000 Americans in 2020. More than 82% of those deaths involved synthetic opioids, like fentanyl.

The LGBTQ+ community is no exception. Statistics show that LGBTQ+ individuals are twice as likely than their heterosexual counterparts to use illicit substances and almost twice as likely to suffer from substance use disorders.

This disparity is believed to be caused by social stigma, discrimination, increased risk of harassment, and other challenges that are commonly experienced by members of the LGBTQ+ community. This silent epidemic has been wreaking havoc across the United States for far too long, and AHF is more than ready to take action.


Opioid use, misuse, abuse, and overdose collectively constitutes a threat to public health. AHF's Opioid Overdose Prevention Program is Medication-assisted therapy, combined with

behavioral health interventions (and counseling). AHF has already signed a standing order in the State of California, for employees to receive formal training to distribute naloxone-an opioid adversary that will rapidly reverse an overdose. AHF also offers fentanyl test strips as a part of its overdose prevention program.

While they aren't perfect, fentanyl test strips are a valuable tool for a harm reduction strategy when used as directed. The test strips are available for staff to order in the AHF Marketplace, and AHF patients can request up to 10 free strips per month from their AHF pharmacist.

AHF is proud to be taking a stand to prevent opioid overdose, and we'll never turn anyone away who is in need of our program.

# WHEN NEEDED, AHF IS THERE FIRST RESPONDERS PROVIDE HURRICANE DISASTER RELIEF

Providing disaster relief is a crucial component of **Family Relief in Fort Myers** protecting public health. Over the past decade, In the wake of Hurricane lan-the deadliest AHF has rallied to support countries devastated by hurricane in Florida since 1935–AHF sent such tragedies. The most recent natural disasters emergency supplies to employees in Fort Myers. to strike took our efforts to the shores of Puerto Hurricane lan storms towered as high as 18 feet, Rico and Florida. destroying many staff members' homes.

# AHF provides aid in Puerto Rico

AHF's swift response to Hurricane Fiona meant 4:00 am flights to San Juan one day after the hurricane struck. First responders delivered generators, water purification kits, and tents to people in need.

Additional supplies like tarps, first-aid kits, cots, wheelchairs, and medicine were deployed to the south side of Puerto Rico–where Fiona hit hardest.

AHF is continuing relief efforts in Puerto Rico providing supplies-most notably clean water and power-to as many patients, and as much

community, as possible.

# Laying The Blueprint To Affordable Housing

Homelessness can happen to anyone. It's unexpected and jarring like a category five hurricane. As of January 2020, there are an estimated 161,548 people experiencing homelessness on any given day in the state of California.

Since September of 2021, California has cleared an average of 100 encampments per month, totalling 1,262 sites and 1,213 tons of trashenough to fill 22 Olympic-size swimming pools. The good news is that California has invested upwards of \$14.7 billion towards homelessness. The statewide approach focuses on encampment resolutions and affordable housing initiatives like the Homekey program.

Many of today's housing discussions focus on those who can no longer afford to stay housed due to the never-ending rising cost of living across the U.S. On October 1, 2022 The Nate Holden Performing Arts Center hosted Housing is a Human Right, AHF's housing advocacy division, which led a discussion

panel on the lack of affordable housing. During their speeches, Housing is a Human Right advocates stressed the need for better homelessness policies.

Moderated by Josh Haskell from ABC News and Tammi Mac from Creatrix Of Soul Prism Collective. the Housing is a Human Right panel featured speakers from the National Coalition for the Homeless, the Hope Center of Chicago, Massachusetts Tenant Organization, Bring America Home Campaign, the Metropolitan Tenant Organization of Chicago, Tenants and Neighbors of New York, LOUD Oregon, and PUSH of Pomona and Santa Monicans for Renters Rights.

Though the 2022 primary elections impact on rent prices and homelesssness is unclear, each panel speaker promoted the need for prosperous communities. They also demanded the expansion of education opportunities to boost economic activity in low income neighborhoods.

Housing is a Human Right has drawn a line in the sand with their mission to change people's lives for the better and push rent stabilization to the top of the state's political agenda. To show politicians what action looks like, the housing rights organization helped design an exhibit showing that affordable housing is obtainable.

Since 2017, the Healthy Housing Foundation has been repurposing vacant hotels and turning them into affordable living units for lowincome individuals and families. This process is known as adaptive reuse.

With the help of the Healthy Housing Foundation, Housing is a Human Right developed an adaptive reuse exhibit to demonstrate to politicians, architects, and government officials that homelessness can be addressed without lengthy delays. The exhibit is open every Tuesday and Thursday from 2 PM to 6 PM at the Barclay Hotel in Downtown Los Angeles. M

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

As of SEPTEMBER 2022, Global Patient Report, AHF now has 1,681,680 clients in care.

This figure represents a census INCREASE (up 35,572 AHF clients or patients worldwide), month-to-month since the July Global Patient Report.

# **AHF Staff:**

A net INCREASE of 78 AHF employees overall worldwide to 7,078 total AHF employees worldwide, including:

- An INCREASE of **39** U.S. staff


