In response to widespread gentrification and a housing crisis that demands urgent action, the AIDS Healthcare Foundation launched the Healthy Housing Foundation with a mission of getting people off of the streets.

Since 2017, the Healthy Housing Foundation has been creating homes for people in need by repurposing vacant hotels and turning them into affordable living units. This renovate-and-repurpose process is known as adaptive reuse.

Through the Healthy Housing Foundation, AIDS Healthcare Foundation provides faster access to longer-term housing for low-income individuals and families. Together, the AIDS Healthcare Foundation and the Healthy Housing Foundation are demonstrating to politicians, government officials, as well as community groups and housing advocates, that clean, safe, and affordable housing can be accomplished without lengthy delays or high costs.

Group is a non-profit organization that has been serving its community for over 23 years. The group enriches, empowers, and helps extend the lives of intergenerational Black queer men through social and educational programs and health and wellness services.

In The Meantime (ITMT) focuses on the mental, emotional, physical, spiritual, and economic well-being of a community that is often isolated and excluded from mainstream society.

But through service and Black-queer celebration, ITMT is uplifting its community and letting everyone in it know, they are worthy. In The Meantime is a place for Black, gay, samegender-loving, and bi-sexual men to be themselves, find fellowship, and get support.

Some of the ways ITMT supports its community is by offering programs and services many Black and/or gay people need but have limited access to. In The Meantime provides a 12-step recovery program, scholarships for Black LGBTQ students, free HIV testing and STI screening, linkage to PrEP, and peer support groups—and that's not even close to all they offer. # Not Ready For Parenthood?

#### TRY PLAN A

**AHF** is unveiling its newest national rotation ads reminding all of us to use a condom when enagaging in sexual activity. Condoms protect against most STIs and HIV, and they are 98% effective for preventing unwanted pregnancies.

#### Plan A

Whether you call it a rubber, a Jimmi, or by its name, be prepared when you have sex and pack a condom. Free condoms are available at all AHF Wellness Centers and most Out of the Closet thrift stores. Visit useacondom.org to learn more safer sex tips and find locations to score a f\*ck load of free condoms.

### Not Ready for Parenthood

This campaign is a reminder that although there are treatments for STIs and HIV, sex without a condom can have serious consequences like what to do about an unexpected pregnancy. That means frequent testing is NOT a substitute for using protection. So stay prepared if you're not ready to parent. Expert Analysis: The pull-out method doesn't work.

#### PATTI LABELLE AND GLADYS KNIGHT SHINE BRIGHT FOR WORLD AIDS DAY

#### AHF hosted its 2022 World AIDS Day Concert on Wednesday,

November 30th, at the The Kennedy Center in Washington D.C. Renowned multi-GRAMMY Award-winning vocalists Patti LaBelle and Gladys Knight delivered show-stopping performances to the packed crowd, which included AHF staff, clients, and supporters.

The event was kicked off with speeches from AHF President Michael Weinstein and Director of the White House Office of National AIDS Policy, Harold Phillips, who reminded those in attendance that millions remain affected by AIDS around the globe, and that the work to raise AIDS awareness and eradicate this disease is far from over.

Midway through the event, longtime humanitarian and AIDS advocate Princess Diana, was posthumously honored with AHF's Lifetime Achievement Award. But of course, Gladys Knight and Patti LaBelle stole the show. A couple of lucky fans even got the chance to dance on stage with one of the living legends.

The crowd erupted when Patti LabBelle kicked off her high heels and turned two staff members into stars as they sang and danced to *Lady Marmalade* with the soulstress.

World AIDS Day is recognized on December 1. In addition to the World Day events, AHF held three simultaneous protests across the U.S. targeting drug maker Gilead Sciences. Gilead's price gouging affects HIV/AIDS patients, and in honor of world AIDS Day, AHF healthcare advocates protested Gilead Sciences and its drug pricing and policies. The nationwide protests took place the same morning on December 1 in Washington, D.C., Miami, FL, and San Diego, CA.
