IN THE LAST 25 YEARS, THE GENDER PAY GAP HAS SHRUNK ONLY 8%.



A small agency with a big impact, WORLD (Women Organized to Respond to Life-Threatening Diseases) partnered with AHF in 2014.

WORLD improves the lives and health of women, girls, families, and communities affected by HIV through peer-based education, wellness services, advocacy, and leadership development.

They envision a world where women, girls, and families affected by HIV and AIDS have the tools, support, and knowledge to live healthy and productive lives with dignity.



Some of WORLD's programs include:

Peer Advocacy

Peer advocates provide one-on-one emotional and practical support for women living with HIV and AIDS and refer them to resources and services.

Retreats

These are designed to strengthen social networks and reduce isolation. WORLD retreats provide up-to-date treatment information and tips on accessing high-quality HIV medical care.

Leadership Institute

WORLD's Leadership Institute is open to all women who want to explore policy & advocacy, effective communication, goal-setting, and care about the health and wellness of their communities.

PrEP Navigation

Our PrEP Navigation Program is designed to support HIV-negative women in accessing & adhering to the only FDA-approved medication that can PREVENT HIV infection.

Outreach + Linkage

Actively seeking HIV-positive women who are out of care and helps them get back to care for better health.

AHF Federation is a consortium of AIDS Service Organizations (ASOs) and community groups committed to HIV/AIDS education, prevention, advocacy, medical treatment, and support for underserved populations across the nation. Through the collective, organizations work to build upon their regional knowledge, experience, and operations within AHF's innovative network of support to expand their capacity to meet the growing needs of people in the communities they serve.

If You Don't Use It, Lose It.



AHF and its Healthy Housing Foundation hosted a groundbreaking and dedication ceremony on Skid Row in Downtown Los Angeles on Sunday, January 16, 2022 to showcase their ongoing commitment to eradicate homelessness in L.A. and across the country. The new building, the "Renaissance Center" will be comprised of a 216-unit, 15-story modular highrise which will serve as housing for extremely-low-income and formerly homeless individuals.

The Renaissance Center will become the 13th affordable housing site in the Los Angeles area that Healthy Housing Foundation has purchased and will repurpose as homeless or extremely-low-income housing since late 2017 when AHF first kicked off its housing program. Healthy Housing Foundation also has plans to build new affordable housing units in Ft.

Lauderdale, FL near its AHF Southern Bureau Headquarters.

Notable speakers included AHF President Michael Weinstein. City Council Member Kevin de Leon, Sue Himmelrich Mayor of Santa Monica, and many others who participated in the dedication. The ceremony was timed to honor Martin Luther King Day and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s legacy of housing justice advocacy. Housing for people of color, more specifically Black Americans, has been an ongoing issue for several decades. To date, more than half of Black Americans don't own homes. This shows that discriminatory housing laws and practices continue to be a huge challenge.

"Today's groundbreaking ceremony for the new 216-unit Renaissance Center, represents another milestone in the history of AHF," said Cynthia

Davis. MPH. Domestic Vice-Chair, AHF Board of Directors. "The fact that we are holding this ceremony, while also commemorating Martin Luther King Day, is a testament to AHF's vision to 'Fight For What Is Right' while working tirelessly to end homelessness in Los Angeles County. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was an advocate fighting for the civil and human rights of the disenfranchised. the poor, and the homeless; AHF is continuing his legacy of advocacy with the construction of the new Renaissance Center."

AHF launched Healthy Housing Foundation in 2017 to address the rampant affordable housing crisis sweeping the nation by providing fast, easy, and intentional access to affordable housing with a focus on addressing the needs of lowincome individuals, struggling families, youth, and those living with chronic illness.
